

Yes, transferred from No another hospital Planned mode of delivery at time of admission=planned labor for vaginal delivery Actual mode of delivery=unplanned cesarean delivery Primary indication for unplanned cesarean delivery=failed induction of labor, latent phase arrest of dilation, active phase arrest of dilation, or arrest of descent

Primary Indication for Cesarean Delivery: Latent Phase Arrest of Dilation






*Patients who were admitted in spontaneous labor and who are less than 6cm dilated, having adequate contractions, and not progressing should follow a labor augmentation pathway (see Primary Indication for Cesarean Delivery: Failed Induction of Labor) or be discharged home if safe.
